

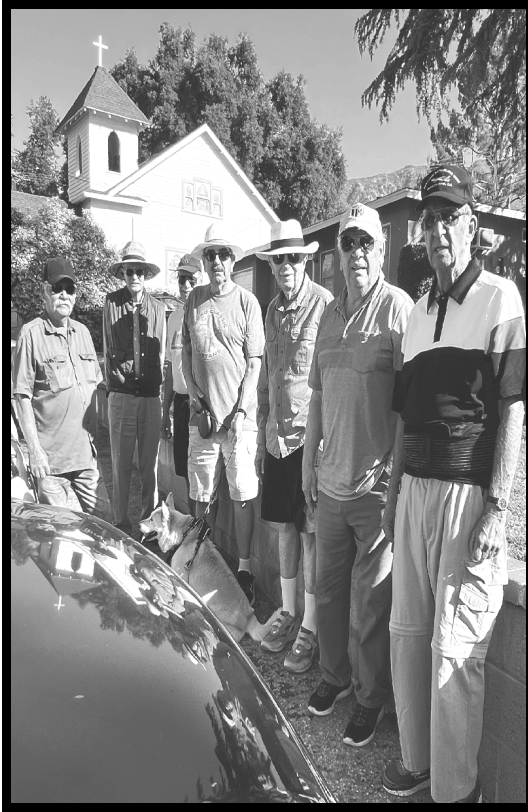

Dave said without any hesitation that his life changed and IMMEDIATELY loved it here and feels like this was when life and happiness began for him. Erin loves the opportunity her children are having by being with their grandmother. Erin said just watching the connection and love they share and even little things that happen daily being with their grandmother will be lifetime memories.

We talked about the traffic and various incidents on Mountain Avenue where she lives. She smiled and said, well, that morning there had just been an incident a short distance from their home. A young man driving down the hill, was not sure of the actual details, whether he was speeding, or a vehicle malfunction occurred but the engine or the front of the car was on fire and the young man needed assistance. She showed me a picture of a blazing fire coming from the car. Since her return to the area, there have been several incidents involving crime, accidents, etc. which are of great concern to her.

Erin's brother suffered severe injuries from a car fire outside their home during the 2003 Grand Prix Fire, and sadly as a result after a couple of years of treatment she lost her brother, so the consequences of what these fires can do are especially scary and painful to her.

Erin has served with charities, groups and associations involving the community and her children's activities. She believes it is important to volunteer in the community and to work with others to get things accomplished.

Erin, like most adults who have grown up in the Heights and returned, could not be happier. She loves living here with the "no hustle or bustle" and all the friendly people. We appreciate Erin's interest in the Board even though she is still employed full-time at Bank of America and is willing to take on this added responsibility. Welcome Erin!

The San Bernardino County Sheriff Deputies welcome five new volunteers to the San Antonio Heights Patrol. Baldy Citizens on Patrol and have begun their duties patrolling both communities.

## Sharron Jungman



Sharron began with her life at the age of eighteen when she and her husband, Mike, married, had three children, lived in Los Angeles County, and had been flipping houses for over thirty years when they decided to buy a house in Altadena to rehab and with the intention of it being their home – but opportunities took them to Pasadena, then Glendora and yes, several years ago landed in San Antonio Heights where she lives in a Tudor house that required a lot of demolition, clean-up, transformation, make-over and now she can say, she loves her new home, her neighbors, new

Mike did his training at the Police Academy and Sheriff's Training Center and feels that what he learned has been helpful and meaningful in performing the duties. He loves collaborating with the sheriffs and they have all been very friendly, appreciative, and helpful. On occasions when he needed to contact a sheriff, he has always gotten quick responses and the deputies always show their appreciation.

**Heights horse owners concerned with non-authorized motor vehicles such as motorcycles and golf carts on the trail. This multi-use trail is for use by equestrians, hikers, and bicyclists. This article will inform you of some of the issues that exist. Please, we are asking for your help if you should observe any motorcycle or gas activity on the trail.**



We would like to have all of our residents included and the concerns of illegal motorcycle and gasoline equipment on the trails bordering the Heights that hopefully you are enjoying. The Association received a call from Suzanne Farris, longtime resident and horse owner, who extensively rides her horse on the trail. Several residents with concerns contacted the Board who had encountered motorcycles and/or gasoline vehicles at various times on the Cucamonga Creek Trail connecting San Antonio Heights with Rancho Cucamonga. There have been multiple complaints about motorcycles and golf carts on the trail inappropriately or illegally. The trails are for equestrians, hikers, and bicyclists.

A San Bernardino County Trail Regulation sign is located at each entrance. It clearly states that the trail is a **NON-MOTORIZED MULTI-PURPOSE Trail**. Trail users' behavior on the trails must always be considerate and must not be engaging in activity that might spook a horse or make it react dangerously to individuals. Suzanne and other horse owners living in the Heights did attend our meeting March 22<sup>nd</sup> along with Deputy Chris Henry who was invited by the Board to attend. There were photos of some offenders made available to the group and below are some of the points made during the discussion:

- Deputy Henry stated electric bicycles are legal on the trail, but motor bikes are not legal. He reviewed the photos and noted the offenders looked young.
- Trail Regulations signage is located at each entrance (East 24<sup>th</sup> & 25<sup>th</sup>).
- A Board member reported the crossbar on the trail gate at 24<sup>th</sup> St is missing which makes it possible to enter easily. This occurs mostly in the late afternoons with both electric bikes and motorcycles.
- Residents noted there is more activity during the weekend. There have been several cuts in the fence for access along the Rancho Cucamonga side. Heights' residents continually repair the fence.
- Tom McCarthy inquired if there was a speed limit along the path: answer unknown.
- Bob Cable believes there are cameras along the spillways. Bob will talk to Holiday Rock as soon as possible to ask if they can close off access areas. He will also contact our County Supervisor regarding their responsibility and liability. Deputy Henry will check with County Legal and Code Enforcement regarding the legality of golf carts on the trail. He will check with Rancho Cucamonga Sheriffs for more coverage on their side.
- Board members suggested COP include the two trail gates in their patrol with the possibility of more exposure to help prevent illegal entrances.
- No new information was reported at our April meeting. I contacted Suzanne Farris for any updated information, and she said she had been intentionally avoiding riding during the time she knows the riders are present. Suzanne said she had seen them on the streets when headed to the trails. Also, surprisingly she has seen e-bikes and motorcycles on the sidewalks and postings on the Heights Neighbors Face Book page about these vehicles and bikes driven carelessly in our neighborhood.



The Association will continue to follow any activity or progress in our next newsletter and/or send an email notice from [SAHBULLETINBOARD@gmail.com](mailto:SAHBULLETINBOARD@gmail.com)” to everyone who is signed up. You keep us informed – we will keep you posted. We ask you to continue to be aware of these situations and if you see inappropriate motorcycle use in the Heights particularly near the trails, please report it to Dispatch (909) 829-7311 and/or leave a message for one of our Deputies Chris Henry or Ismael Diaz at (909) 476-6293. Remember, one phone call might not have an influence but unknowingly there may have already been or will be other calls to warrant the need for attention if it can be available.

## **THE LATEST ON WHAT BURGLARS ARE DOING NOW!**

Another matter residents should be aware of is the latest on the BURGLARS PLANTING CAMERAS IN YARDS. Daily Bulletin Article published information on May 27<sup>th</sup>. A spokesperson wrote “they are using these sophisticated camera devices to gain access into homes. The whole point of the camera is to put them in bushes and trees just outside the property they are interested in, and they will use the footage to see the behaviors of the house—who lives there, who goes in and out, what happens during the day, and they can then focus on the timeframe when no one is home” This article spoke of incidents in all our surrounding counties. Check your yards!!! Typically, they target multimillion dollar homes but not always. We are all at risk.
